For our 34th annual Readers' Choice Awards survey, registered voters weighed in on their favorite resorts around the globe. As the world has begun to reopen and readjust, the results reflect the kinds of properties you longed to visit when you couldn't travel and the ones you returned to first once you could. More than 800,000 of you filled out our survey, and while we're always curious about where you've been and where you're going, we're especially excited to learn about the truly memorable places that sparked your imagination and stayed with you when travel seemed out of reach. Here are the 50 resorts you loved most this year.

It's not like Bali needed another hotel, especially around the island's teeming spiritual hub of Ubud. But the notoriously inventive Bill Bensley envisioned something wholly divergent for this 10-acre patch of jungle north of the city on the Wos River: a fanciful take on a tented camp pitched by early-19th-century spice traders. This is hotel as theater: On arrival, visitors receive a survival kit (sunscreen, insect repellent, a map), plus a carved walking stick to help pick their way over the suspension bridges leading to 22 black canvas tents with saltwater plunge pools. Bensley's light-footprint approach (not a single tree was felled) means the camp blends seamlessly into its backdrop, the tent walls porous to the hooting birds of the jungle. It's ideal for those looking to approach Bali in a more conscious way—staying here is like returning to the island's former wild self.

Suddenly, there is a very big reason to stay on in Cambodia after seeing the temples at Angkor Wat. Roughly halfway between the capital, Phnom Penh, and the south coast are 850 acres of protected private land hosting a flamboyant new camp. Opt to arrive by zip-line, landing next to a waterfall with huge double sun loungers in vivid greens and yellows, driftwood statues of life-size elephants, and 15 tented rooms, some with rolltop bathtubs on the riverside deck. While staying here, join anti-elephant-poaching patrols or explore the hardwood forest between the Southern Cardamom and Kirirom national parks by mountain bike and kayak. There are seemingly unlimited spa treatments, a sensational 100-foot-long pool, and a daily menu under brilliant chef Patricia Yeo, who uses foraged greens, mushrooms, and fruits from the forest. Shinta Mani Wild opens up an entire region to the jetset, with style and a firm focus on the environment.

Just 75 miles south of Missoula, Triple Creek nevertheless manages to feel like it's in its own world. With 25 log cabins looking out onto the Bitterroot Mountains, all-inclusive Triple Creek pairs upscale rusticity with isolation—we're talking exposed log walls, slate bathrooms, and private hot tubs. Fill your days with horseback riding, hiking or snowshoeing, a fly-casting clinic, archery, or tennis, or simply relax by the pool.

The Himalayan kingdom of Bhutan is home to two magical destination retreats by COMO, each of which offers its own unique pleasures. In the Paro Valley, the intimate COMO Uma Paro melds Bhutanese craftsmanship with signature COMO amenities—especially those centered around wellness. You're in a prime location for hiking and exploring the natural wonders around you, not to mention trekking to visit nearby Buddhist temples. About a three-hour drive away, the 11-room COMO Uma Punakha sits at the farthest edge of the Punakha Valley, offering guests views of terraced rice fields, the temple of Khamsum Yuley Namgay, and snowcapped Himalayan peaks. The restaurant Bukhari, so named for the traditional Bhutanese fireplace, might be the best place to savor these vistas. Park yourself on the outdoor terrace, preferably by a smoking, standing fireplace, for a seasonally driven dinner made with local organic ingredients—red rice, hand-ground buckwheat flour, apple cider vinegar, and hand-molded farm cheese.

46. andBeyond Sandibe Okavango Safari Lodge (Nxabega Okavango Tented Camp, Xaranna Okavango Delta, and Sandibe Okavango Delta) — Botswana →

Luxury safari outfitter and Beyond operates a trio of lodges in Botswana's Okavango Delta, each with their own unique appeal. Set on a private concession, adjacent to wildlife-rich Moremi Game Reserve, Sandibe Okavango Safari Lodge features a striking series of decks, indoor/outdoor lounges, pathways, and curved, wooden rooftops—all inspired by the nests of golden weaver birds—that make this a safari experience far from the ordinary. Xaranna Okavango Delta Camp, meanwhile, is secluded on its own island (arrival is by motorboat most of the year), and water lilies, hippos, and frogs provide inspiration for its playful decor. Nearby, Nxabega Okavango Tented Camp comprises nine tented suites that look out on mopane woodlands and flooded grasslands, offering unparalleled access to Botswana's famed wildlife.

45. C Lazy U Ranch — Granby, Colorado \rightarrow

This Colorado dude ranch offers a family-friendly version of the American West experience, with horseback riding, white water rafting, fly fishing, ice skating, skiing, and sleigh rides. On 8,500 acres, the ranch does it all, pairing programs for kids with luxurious spa treatments for adults. Log cabins have been renovated in recent years, and with their indoor, heated riding area, visitors can ride horseback year-round.

Eschewing traditional safari motifs, this trio of private villas in South Africa's Sabi Sands Game Reserve is all about clean lines and ultra-modern design: Think raw concrete, rusted steel, statement blown-glass chandeliers, and colorful works of art, including portraits by Loyiso Mkize. A similarly forward-thinking approach to sustainability means the property is equipped with solar panels, a greywater recycling system, and a fleet of electric Land Cruiser safari vehicles. Prowling the surrounding landscape as stealthily as leopards, the cruisers allow guests to get surprisingly close to the Big Five, which are easier to encounter here than almost anywhere else across Africa.

43. Six Senses Bhutan (Thimphu, Punakha, Paro, Gangtey, and Bumthang) — Bhutan \rightarrow

Six Senses is the latest of the global hotel heavyweights to land in Bhutan, and its culturally considered approach is a natural fit for a pristine kingdom that has been largely unchanged for centuries. The wellness-focused "hotel" is actually a

Bumthang, which features a peaceful design aesthetic inspired by the surrounding forests. Of all the outposts, rustic and intimate Punakha is the standout. The lush rice paddies and traditional farmhouses of the low-lying countryside inspired the Himalayan-wood living room and bar that cantilevers dramatically over the pool. There is a spa and 16 calming all-wood suites split across four pale-buttermilk buildings (plus a trio of villas), all with a bukhari stove and sliding glass doors that open onto a deck where the forest-clad mountains appear almost close enough to touch.

and villas are decorated in warm neutrals which draw your eyes outdoors toward the bright colors of the blue Aegean Sea, the green garden, and the vibrant pink bougainvilleas. Peruvian chef Diego Muñoz runs the two onsite restaurants, which pair Turkish and Latin American influences, while a Turkish hammam is, of course, the centerpiece of the resort's spa.

Blonde wood and glass walls render the whole triple-deck interior Champagne-colored and the golden-leafed sculpture hanging in the atrium is truly lovely. Very large bedroom terraces, plus indoor and outdoor pools all offer panoramic views of the world-famous (and now UNESCO World Heritage-listed) vineyards, while the top-floor bar has access to the cellar's 257 different Champagnes, as well as views that look over the vineyards.

made of Indonesian wood, float like water lilies on the central reflecting pool and are surrounded on three sides by floor-to-ceiling sliding glass walls that lead down to sunken dining areas and bedroom floors inlaid with teak. Opt for one of the Ocean Villas—the most private of all—and enjoy an infinity-edge pool, a private garden brimming with native island vegetation, and a dockside day bed, perfect for taking that much-needed cat nap.

The Tierra brand has found a sweet spot creating otherworldly hotels in the middle of natural wonders, including rooms set alongside craggy mountains overlooking choppy bodies of water in Patagonia. But the Atacama property is undoubtedly the brand's lodestar, with its cowhide rugs, mud-brick walls, and rattan daybeds. It's tempting to just want to stay by the lap pool overlooking the sometimes-smoking Licancabur volcano. But the excursions, led by the hotel's incredibly well-informed guides, are the kind visitors won't want to miss—whether that's heading up to 14,000 feet pre-dawn to drink coca-leaf tea around natural geysers or stargazing with a local astronomer to see the Milky Way more clearly than anywhere else on the planet.

embraces its winter-wonderland theme with a design scheme inspired by a 19th-century Austro-Hungarian castle. The folk murals, stained glass, and crackling fireplaces may evoke a scene out of the Brothers Grimm, but don't be fooled by the fairy-tale surroundings—this place is all about over-the-top luxury. That means an Hermès-designed horse-drawn carriage, a Rolls-Royce Cullinan car service, helicopter transfers to the airport, and a ski lounge brimming with gear by Bernard Orcel.

Tucked high in the mountains of Pérez Zeledon in southern Costa Rica, this 864-acre property—the first Auberge Resort in Central America—brings glamour and luxury to an otherwise rugged terrain. Its 50 spacious casitas are decked out in dark wood and leather, and outfitted with sprawling terraces overlooking the mountains or San Ysidro Valley. There's a ton to keep nature lovers happy, including horseback riding, swimming, and a visit to the on-site organic farm. But there's plenty of fun to be had indoors as well. The resort has three excellent farm-to-table restaurants and the largest spa in Central America, which is equipped with its own hydrotherapy center.

The French ski resort of Courchevel 1850 is an adventurer's paradise, known for its challenging black runs and off-piste terrain. Inside the four walls of this nouveau Alpine lodge, however, interior designer Sybille de Margerie has created a cocoon of coziness—cashmere and furs, cuckoo clocks and fluffy sheep sculptures, with a warm signature scent of orange, cardamom, amber, and patchouli wafting through the halls. After a day out on the slopes, weary skiers can retreat to the hotel's Russian banya, hammam, or infinity-edge indoor pool. Or, better yet, spend a few hours traversing through the innovative tasting menu at chef Yannick Alléno's Le 1947, the only three-Michelin-starred restaurant in Courchevel.

There's Hawaii, and there's Lanai. Driving through Lanai City—still more plantation outpost than town—on the way from the airport to the hotel, there are none of the usual signifiers: no ABC Stores or shave ice stands or traffic lights. In 2012, billionaire Larry Ellison purchased 98 percent of Lanai, including this hotel, which he closed in 2015 for a major overhaul. Rooms were freshened up with teak and zebrawood; key cards morphed into waterproof wristbands, handy for late-night dips in the new pool. Nobu and Malibu Farm were clever additions—sashimi and salads are brilliant after sun and sea. But what really makes this hotel stand out is that there's no feeling of being on- or off-property. Every part of Lanai, from sunbathe-naked-empty Polihua Beach to the interior's Garden of the Gods, with otherworldly red-rock formations, feels all yours.

On arrival at Cottar's Camp in your open-air Land Rover, you immediately feel you've stepped back in time. Cottar's is almost 100 years old, having been established by the grandfather of the current owner, Calvin Cottar, and today, it has the highest number of Gold Level guides of any safari property in Africa. The camp has great traditional interiors, full of campaign and colonial antiques and lined with kilims, cotton dhurries, and paraphernalia from decades of African safaris. There are nine tents in total (one honeymoon tent, four double tents, and four family suites), all with bathrooms, and some even have living rooms with fireplaces.

Set on 1,800 acres of high desert outside of Bend, Oregon, this approachably luxe resort invites families to live out their cowboy and cowgirl fantasies, with abundant opportunities for horseback riding, hiking to nearby buttes, fishing in the (stocked) pond, and making s'mores under the stars. Accommodations include ranch house rooms and suites plus 65 cabins, which speak to rustic surroundings with cowhide fixtures, fireplaces, and lots of leather. The entire property is suffused with the scent of sagebrush and juniper, nowhere more so than at the impossibly scenic Brasada Canyons golf course, which offers views out toward the snow-capped Cascades.

In the 1950s, Don Abelardo Rodríguez, son of Mexico's former president, had his choice of real estate in Baja Sur. He decided on the very tip of the peninsula, between the calm Sea of Cortez and the crashing Pacific, as the site for the area's first hotel of note, the 15-room Palmilla. Sixty-some years on, the luxury hotel set has moved in, and much at the Palmilla has changed—but not enough to keep nearly half of its guests from coming back each year. The hotel, which was taken over by One&Only in 2004, still has the best location. The hacienda-style rooms with wrought-iron chandeliers and updated mission-style furniture continue to embody the pueblo Cabo once was. But it still comes down to the service here, just like it always has—it's all about the small, thoughtful touches, such as the roaming masseuse who offers foot massages while you lie face down on a pool chair.

Soneva founders Sonu and Eva Shivdasani pioneered the kind of barefoot, souped-up Robinson Crusoe luxury the Maldives are now known for when they opened Soneva Fushi in these waters back in 1995. This latest update, spread across five islets in the northern Noonu Atoll, raised the bar again in 2016: a surreal collection of 25 enormous shingled neo-Victorian villas, some with wraparound slides plunging into a lagoon that's so impossibly lucid you can see colorful parrotfish, rays, and mottled nudibranchs from shore. Soneva's dedication to sustainability is so much more than the green varnish you get elsewhere, and here that manifests in its own recycling center, seawater pools, organic gardens, and an open-air cinema equipped with wireless headphones so as not to disturb the nesting turtles nearby.

27. Finch Bay Galapagos Hotel — Santa Cruz Island, Ecuador \rightarrow

If you've only ever visited the Galapagos Islands by sea, this beachfront eco-lodge on the south side of Santa Cruz Island makes a strong case for getting your feet in the sand and sticking around for a while. Expect breezy porches strung with hammocks, a restaurant serving sustainable slipper lobster, and access to a mangrove-lined beach. The hotel offers plenty of excursions (including yacht tours and visits to a giant tortoise reserve), but one of the true joys of this place is simply wandering around the island. Exploring by foot means you'll have access to the Charles Darwin Research Station, the marine iguanas of Tortuga Bay Beach, and the crystal-clear swimming holes known as Las Grietas.

26. One&Only Nyungwe House — Nyamasheke Nyungwe Forest Reserve, Rwanda \rightarrow

Set within a working tea plantation at the edge of the pristine Nyungwe Forest National Park, this luxury lodge with 22 suites is one of the most upscale hotels in Rwanda. Plus, it gives you easy access to the park's population of chimpanzees, monkeys, and other wildlife. The nature treks in Rwanda aren't your average roll-around-in-a-Jeep safari. They often involve hours of hiking, up steep volcanic slopes and on occasionally muddy trails. Which is to say, the people who are coming here are the adventurous types—albeit those who want to come back to a king-sized bed, full-service gym, and spa at the end of the day.

One&Only Gorilla's Nest

The name of this eco-minded lodge in Rwanda gives a clue to its raison d'être: the mountain gorillas. It may be the latest in a line of lodges to arrive in the foothills of the Virunga volcanoes, but the 21-room property delivers much more than great apes. Mountain biking, drumming, coffee tasting, and archery are all on the agenda, along with the prerequisite jungle pool and spa. Its stilted wooden lodges are tucked among the eucalyptus forest and bamboo (and, interestingly, 3,000 species of rose). This is Tarzan's treehouse meets high design.

From the minute your seaplane, manned by a barefoot pilot, lands on this blissfully untouristed Fijian island, you're in for a vacation that will be hard to top. Ever. So many moments stand out: snorkeling with sharks at the Great Astrolabe reef; checking out the on-island farm; eating coral trout sashimi for breakfast. The departure experience—when the entire staff assembles to sing traditional farewell Fiji songs (with gusto)—is very emotional.

At the foot of North America's largest ski resort, a majestic chateau rises out of a forest of snow-capped trees. Steps from the new Blackcomb Gondola, it's hard to imagine a better location for skiers. Fairmont tend to feel very storybook and old-school, but a recent renovation added some contemporary flair. The addition of Alpine Suites brought a sexy and spacious room category to the premises—each of these rooms comes with spa showers, a fireplace, and sprawling mountain views.

Guest feedback was taken very seriously when and Beyond rebuilt its flagship camp in early 2018, which is likely why the designers didn't make any unnecessary updates in the redo. Nothing was changed for the sake of change: vintage silver, crystal decanters, leather armchairs, and extravagantly deep sofas were reused, recycled or reupholstered, while old-world maps and brass fittings were added. New to camp is a family suite, gin bar, and safari boutique stocked exclusively with home-grown designer labels. The Mara Triangle is the sharp edge of Masai Mara safaris, and not just during migration season. On any given day, the open plains are thrumming with elephants, giraffes, zebras, jackals, and lions. Being in a private concession means guests can also go out on night drives, have silver-service bush banquets accompanied by deeply resonant Maasai chanting, and the chance to do a walk or trail run with a Maasai guide.

21. Soneva Kiri — Koh Kood, Thailand \rightarrow

Soneva Kiri, on the still pristine Koh Kood, is among the most exciting resorts in all of Southeast Asia. Guests land on a private airstrip on neighboring Koh Mai Si and then take a short motor boat ride to a jetty jutting into a pretty cove. The resort sprawls over the island's northern tip, and butlers shepherd guests over the manicured grounds by electric cart. Virtuously constructed from sustainable eucalyptus logs, native bamboo, and treated pine, the 36 villas are multistructured complexes spacious enough for an entire family and appointed with a dressing area, a separate dining deck, indoor and outdoor showers, and a private infinity pool. Chef Khun Benz spearheads the resort dining—including inside a bamboo "Treepod" served by a waiter on zip line—which matches dishes with a dizzyingly long wine list.

The high-stakes Cabo hotel scene has been particularly frenetic for the past few years, with fresh openings from big-name players like Four Seasons, Montage, and Viceroy. Amid the fray, Ritz-Carlton managed to seek out a 20-acre plot for its fourth reserve, overlooking the indigo Sea of Cortez and built partially on the sand dunes. Suites feel both comfortable and considered, with vast living rooms featuring blue-and-white textiles, objets d'art from local artisans (woven leather baskets, painted pottery), and terraces with firepits. But it's the staff that truly make the place stand out: remembering favorite breakfast tables and knowing the right chaise lounge around the enormous L-shaped pool at which to drop off each swimmer's margarita. In one of the world's most elevated hotel towns, Ritz-Carlton shows that the bar can always be raised.

Done up in a relaxing palette of Caribbean Sea blues, sandy beiges, and cumulus-cloud whites, the 371 rooms at this adults-only, all-inclusive resort are designed to set minds at ease at every turn. The hotel occupies an enviable strip of real estate on the Zona Hotelera waterfront, but guests won't need to wander far to occupy time during their stays: The 11 bars, restaurants, and cafés include such standouts as Sea Corner for ceviches and tropical cocktails, while spa treatments draw on the aromas and ingredients of the region, including avocado, cocoa, and coffee.

Outside, though, through the dense surrounding stands of palm, is a full-on luxe seaside hotel, with a pristine talcum-fine beach and a magnificent swimming pool set against a backdrop of towering pink peaks. Not surprising, given it's a Six Senses, many people come here for the spa and its bespoke programs of treatments and fitness.

All to say, Sensei Lanai, A Four Seasons Resort is about as niche as it gets. It's also quite possibly the loveliest spot to give mind-body wellness a real shot.

As looks go, it doesn't get chicer than this, but the whimsical touches—turtles drawn in the sand along the path to the villa, thoughtful little notes from your butler left alongside the pitchers of fresh juice—are what truly give this place its character.

Rooms are spare and enormous, with lots of wood and one or two pops of bright color—some even have small, rectangular plunge pools for mini-laps. The food at Aux Amis is unabashedly modern French, with attention paid to proper portions in the tropics: in other words, not too much. Water sports enthusiasts have an expanse of calm shallow waters for kayaking, kite-surfing, and snorkeling—a flotilla of a dozen sea turtles that survived the storms of 2017 remain in residence and are easily visible.

No white gloves and marble columns, instead something much more low key and low footprint. Following recent renovations, each of the 80 rooms and one- and two-bedroom suites and villas now has a mid-century-modern-meets-the-ocean vibe: lots of sleek lines, earthy colors and the original exposed stone walls, with plenty of driftwood, coral, and woven baskets on the shelves. Some have their own plunge pools and all are within steps of the hotel's half-mile white-sand beach. The food is exceptionally good, in part because of the on-site farm—a nod to Rockefeller's sustainable ethos—along with composting projects and reduced single-use plastics.

For more beach bliss, the front desk can arrange private yacht charters to island-hop around the archipelago.

This is no traditional safari set-up: the sleek, Italian-inflected design gives the place a bit of cosmopolitan flair, as does a pavilion with a library, shop, fitness room, and infinity pool—all while embracing the wild surroundings.

It's a fittingly spectacular viewing lined up alongside the camp's equally spectacular accommodations: three free-standing luxury villas, each uniquely designed. (Think lots of raw blond woods in the Farm House; stone fireplaces and sink-into-'em couches over at the River House; and a staff of eight, plus an infinity pool and African artwork at the Owner's Home). And unlike many of the lodges across the region, Wi-Fi here is fast and available everywhere, meaning your 13-year-old won't have to wait until she's back in Johannesburg airport to upload her shot of leopard cubs to Instagram.

Amid the ruins of the iconic Hotel Paracas that crumbled during an August 2007 earthquake, famed Peruvian architect Bernardo Fort-Brescia designed this new 120-room resort (part of Starwood's Luxury Collection) in the coastal desert three hours south of Lima. Two-story white bungalows blend into the dune-filled horizon, contrasting the deep-blue waters of the Paracas National Reserve. While the bay is better for windsurfing, the daybeds at the glitzy pool scenes, where roving waiters fetch a steady supply of passion fruit sours and ceviche, have become the new it spot for Lima's well-to-do. The hotel makes a restful base for a slew of nearby adventures—you can do scenic flights of the Nazca desert geoglyphs in its private jet, yacht rides to spot Humboldt penguins on the Islas Ballestas, and pisco tastings at the Viñas de Oro distillery right at the resort.

Twice daily game drives are led by expert rangers far from Kruger's crowds, which means you're almost guaranteed to be able to check off the Big Five before you leave.

Daybeds indoors and out are a relaxing pleasure, as are teak chaises by the riverfront pool. The hotel wraps around the open-air restaurant, where an East-meets-West menu is served all day long—think a breakfast buffet, loaded with fruits and juices, and later, flavorful plates of Kashmir chili and Indian spice—marinated chicken. A wrought iron staircase twists up to the rooftop bar. If you're looking to spice up your staid vacation itinerary, activities worth booking include a Muay Thai kickboxing class and a sunset river cruise.

Boulders Lodge, meanwhile, was named after the ancient rocks strewn along the banks of the Sand River, and the 12 glass-fronted suites have artfully pared-down interiors, featuring fossilized tree stumps and other found objects. And Castleton Lodge occupies the ancestral home of Singita founder Luke Bailes. Its Cape Dutch charm, mullioned windows, antiques, expert safari guides, and longtime family staff remain—but the wine cellar, state-of-the-art kitchen, and full gym are all new.
